- Instead of giving your children gifts you can't afford and they don't need, spend time with them. Tell them the story of my birth, and why I came to live with you down here. Hold them in your arms and remind them that I love them.
- Pick someone that has hurt you in the past and forgive him or her.
- Someone in your town will attempt suicide because they feel alone and hopeless. Since you don't know who, give everyone a warm smile. It could make a difference.
- Instead of being upset with what retailers call the holiday, be patient with the employees. If they aren't allowed to wish you a "Merry Christmas" that doesn't mean you can't.

Don't forget; I am God and can take care of myself. Just love me and do what I have told you to do. I'll take care of the rest. I'll help you, but the ball is in your court.
